All Saints and All Souls come together in the church's year. Today, on All Saints, we remember that the Church Triumphant and the Church Militant, the saints in heaven and the saints on earth, together make up the Body of Christ. Because Jesus died and rose again, we are not defined by our mortality. We are defined by being part of Him.

As the hymn says, 'we feebly struggle, they in glory shine.' However that is not an essential difference. They feebly struggled too, and we, one day, shall shine in glory. That recognition gives us the perspective we need for All Souls, when we remember the particular people we love who have died and for whom we mourn. If we look at the end of today's gospel, which is the story of the raising of Lazarus, we see that Jesus instructs the crowd to participate in, even to complete, his miracle. He calls Lazarus out of the tomb, but he tells the crowd to unbind him. And both of these things matter. It is Jesus who has the power to heal, to feed, to restore, to bring to life, to redeem. At the same time, he calls us to be involved in all his actions: to complete his work on earth until he comes again.
